## A'jia Hotel

This small hotel is located on the shores of the llosphorus, in a 19th century Ottoman mansion. Set light on the water's edge, this could be one of the most romantic places to stay in Istanbul. Whilst the A'jia does not benefit from the avalanche of facilities available in larger palatial hotels, it is far less anonymous and somehow more exclusive, thanks to the small number of rooms. # **MARINAS**

### Atakoy Marina

This marina on the European shores of Istanbul, some 10 km to the west of the city centre, is one of the city's main yachting centres. Facilities are adequate but space for larger yachts is limited and advance booking is therefore essential. Facilities are mostly oriented towards smaller craft, but the marina boasts a number of well supplied stores in its surroundings. A number of yacht support agents are based here.

### Setur Kalamis & Fernerbahce Marina

On the Asian side of the city, this marina is further afield from the city's touristic attractions but offers good facilities for visiting yachts of up to 70 metres.
